

### The Safety Stop

#### Winter Wheeling & Snow Driving Tips

Even the most capable rigs handle differently once the white stuff hits. Before you hit the trails—or the highway—keep these quick reminders in mind:

##### 1. Air down smartly.

Lower tire pressure increases traction, but too low can risk popping a bead in deep cold. Start around 15–18 psi and adjust based on conditions and tire type.

##### 2. Gentle is faster.

Ease onto the throttle, brakes, and steering. Sudden inputs = lost traction. Slow and steady wins snowy climbs.

##### 3. Keep momentum—don't mash it.

Maintain a steady roll through deeper sections. If you lose momentum, gently back up a few feet and try again rather than spinning tires.

##### 4. Watch your line and terrain.

Snow hides rocks, ruts, and ice sheets. Scout your path when possible and spot each other—especially near drop-offs or water crossings.

##### 5. Know recovery basics.

Carry a strap, shovel, and recovery boards. Keep your winch line warm and clean, and inspect before each pull.

##### 6. Mind your gear.

Dress in layers, pack gloves that work wet, and keep a blanket or sleeping bag in the rig. Always have extra water and snacks—getting stuck in the cold is no joke.

##### 7. Air back up before heading home.

Cold air drops tire pressure fast. Bring a compressor or stop at a station before driving highway speeds.

##### 8. Communication is key.

Run a working radio, share your route, and wheel with a buddy. Snow can change conditions hour by hour.

### Camping Corner

#### This Month's Topic: Tires—The Unsung Hero of Overlanding

Why talk about tires in a camping article? Simple—because they're one of the most overlooked yet critical components of your overlanding setup. While there's no shortage of flashy videos and reviews on camping gear, cooking tools, and recovery equipment, tires rarely get the spotlight they deserve.

Many folks opt for bigger or more aggressive tires, which might be perfect for a purpose-built rock crawler. But for an overlanding rig, that choice isn't always ideal. Sure, aggressive tread helps on muddy or rocky trails, but your vehicle needs a balance: off-road capability, highway comfort, solid tread life, and a load rating that matches your setup.

Once you start loading up with camping gear, a roof rack, bed rack, rooftop tent—or towing an off-road trailer—you may need to upgrade to a higher load range tire. On my own rig, I went up one tire size and chose a mildly aggressive mud-terrain tire with a higher load index (about 350 pounds more per tire).

Why? Because I knew I'd be tackling long-distance trips, fully loaded or towing my camper.

I also made sure to pick a reputable, widely available brand and always carry a matching full-size spare.

After all, you didn't trailer your rig to the campsite—if you damage a tire, you'll need to drive it home.



In the Club: We build a culture of mentorship, sharing knowledge and developing personal relationships.

In Life: Midwest Krawlers is more than off-roading—it's about building each other up, so every interaction off-leads is positive, it's about leaving a positive impact.


